COVID-19 UPDATES

PHASE 1B PROCESS

Vaccines will be delivered to providers for distribution as part of [Phase 1B](#) on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. 750 provider locations will share a total of approximately 100,000 vaccines. Each provider will begin vaccinations the day after their shipment is received. Providers must administer vaccines in each weekly shipment within seven days.

Tentative dates to start vaccinating [Phase 1B populations](#) are:

- Jan. 19, 2021 - Ohioans 80 years of age and older.
- Jan. 25, 2021 - Ohioans 75 years of age and older; those with severe congenital or developmental disorders.
- Feb. 1, 2021 - Ohioans 70 years of age and older; employees of K-12 schools that wish to remain or return to in-person or hybrid learning.
- Feb. 8, 2021 - Ohioans 65 years of age and older.

When a new age group begins, vaccinations may not be complete for the previous age group. It will take a number of weeks to distribute all of the vaccines given the limited doses available.

HOW TO FIND A VACCINE PROVIDER

The Ohio Department of Health has launched a vaccination location finder at vaccine.coronavirus.ohio.gov. This dashboard is searchable by county and zip code and lists contact information for all providers that received vaccines. **This website is not updated in real-time.** Citizens should contact providers individually or visit their county health department's website for specific information on vaccine availability and how to receive a vaccine.


INDUSTRY INFORMATION

TALKING POINTS FOR YOU

- [vaccine.coronavirus.ohio.gov](#) is an online resource for Ohioans to learn which providers received a COVID-19 vaccine allotment and how to contact them. If you or someone you know is eligible to receive a vaccine in Phase 1B, they should use this tool. This is not a scheduling tool; it provides information only. Individuals should contact the provider directly to schedule a vaccination.
- The goals of Ohio's COVID-19 vaccination program is to save lives and to allow students to return to in-person learning; therefore, while the vaccine supply is extremely limited, priority will be given to Ohio's most vulnerable residents and school personnel who commit to remaining open or reopening schools full time or in a hybrid model by March 1st.
- While there is no mandate to receive a vaccine, vaccinations are extremely limited. Ohioans should be aware that, due to shortages, anyone who declines the vaccine at their first opportunity may not have another chance to receive it for some time.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- ✓ Set a good example, by wearing a mask, making virtual accommodations, and maintaining social distance when meeting face-to-face with others.
- ✓ Post on social media to describe how you are working to keep your employees and customers safe (and what they can do to help you maintain a safe environment) using the suggested hashtags.
- ✓ Submit letters to the editor or local news outlets that support the "COVID-19 Key Messages;" wear a mask, wash hands often, and social distance.
- ✓ Participate in local media/radio interviews to support "COVID-19 Key Messages," and help showcase how you and your colleagues in the industry are supporting Ohio's Responsible Restart.

Please use these talking points and social media posts to help amplify the message about the importance of slowing the spread of COVID-19. High spread impacts the health of your employees and the public. Encouraging safe practices will help slow the spread in your community.
